- [PSAT](#) The PSAT/NMSQT® is the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test offered through the College Board and is for assessing students in college-level preparedness. This test is a practice test for the SAT I. This test is available for all 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students. Additionally, the PSAT has a highly regarded scholarship competition for juniors, The National Merit Scholarship Program, and it is regarded highly toward honoring students who achieve at various levels of the test. The test is administered at school in the fall. No make-up test date is available.
- [SAT I](#) The SAT 1 is the main college preparatory test to measure a student's readiness and admission to college. The SAT Reasoning Test is a measure of the critical thinking skills you'll need for academic success in college. The SAT assesses how well you analyze and solve problems—skills you learned in school that you'll need in college. The SAT is typically taken by high school juniors and seniors. Registration and test date information is available at the website.
- [SAT II](#) Known as Subject tests, these are given in English, history, math, science, and language to demonstrate mastery of skills. Used for college admission, placement, and course selection and provide a measure for predicting college success academically. Consult with colleges to determine which tests are required or recommended to take for admission.
- [ACT](#) The ACT® test assesses high school students' general educational development and their ability to complete college-level work. The multiple-choice tests cover four skill areas: English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science. The Writing Test, which is optional, measures skills in planning and writing a short essay. The ACT is typically taken by high school juniors and seniors. Registration and test date information is available at the web-site.
- [AP](#) These are College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB) sponsored tests, which many colleges give advanced standing and/or credit depending on a student's AP score. These exams are administered in May.
