Before Your First Day at FA

Lockers

Students, grades 6 - 12, will receive their locker assignment and combination with their schedule at the Back to School Open House.

Photo Access ID Cards

Students in grades 7 - 12 are issued an access card with photo ID at the beginning of the school year. Students must have their cards to allow them access to the school buildings between 7:40 am and 3:00 pm. In addition to serving as an identification/access card, it is used for lunch purchases. The photo ID access cards feature each student's school picture and are therefore redistributed each year with the most recent school picture. One yearly ID is covered in tuition. ID's that have been lost or damaged will be replaced at a fee.

Official School Emails

Official school emails are sent from communication@foundationacdemy.net and are the main means for communicating important information in a timely manner. All parents/guardians are added to the FA email list based on the information provided in their Family Portal. Visit RenWeb via our website to make updates to your family's profile and make sure you receive those important emails.

The Keystone eNewsletter

The Keystone is our email-based newsletter sent out every Thursday. The Keystone includes school-wide news as well as news specific to each campus. Notices of upcoming school events and reminders are also provided in the e-newsletter. Be sure to subscribe online to make sure you stay up-to-date on the latest news and upcoming events.

RenWeb/FACTS

As an enrolled family, you should have your RenWeb Parent Login information. Students in grades 6 - 12 will use their own student account to access RenWeb (student login information will be provided by IT). Once the school year begins, on RenWeb, you can find up to date information during the year regarding class schedule, class information, homework, attendance, and a family directory. Teacher email addresses are also listed.

Ways to Reach Your Student's Teacher

Any questions or concerns regarding your student or what is occurring in the classroom may be handled by reaching out to your student's teacher. You may contact them by email or voicemail. To leave a voicemail, you may call the main school number for your campus and ask to be transferred to a mailbox. To send an email, you may find the teacher's email address through their class page on RenWeb or on the website.

School Calendar

Foundation Academy's calendar is located on the website. This is where you look to find out when school events are and what days school is closed. You can select to filter calendar information by group or campus by using the funnel icon in the upper right hand corner of the calendar. (Athletics games are listed on the calendar, but practice schedules are sent out to the teams by their coaches). The Official Academic Calendar is located under "Parent Resources" on the website.

General FAQs

What should my student wear the first day of school?

Students should wear their regular school uniform on the first day of school. For detailed information on school uniforms, please refer to the Student/Parent Handbook.

At what time will the student be counted tardy?

Students who are not physically seated in class by 7:40 am at Upper School or 8:15 am at Lower School are considered tardy and should report to the main office to obtain a tardy slip before going to class.

What should I do if my student is absent?

For Lower School, please email the homeroom teacher of your student before the official tardy time for absences and late arrivals.

For Upper School, please contact the main office before the official tardy time for absences and late arrivals by emailing attendance@foundationacademy.net.

Pre-arranged absence forms may be picked up from the main office of your campus.

How do I sign my student out during the day?

If you pick up your student before the end of the school day, please go to the main office and sign them out. One of the administrative assistants will contact the classroom and have your student come to the office to meet you.

Does FA offer before or after school care?

Parents may register their students in after school care through FA's Extended Care Program. Extended care is available from 3:30 pm to 6:00 pm. To register, contact the main office. At the Plant Street and Lakeside campuses, complimentary before care is offered beginning at 7:30 am.

Preschool FAQs

Does my student need to be toilet trained?

Yes. All students are expected to be toilet trained by the first day of school.

Does my student need a uniform?

Yes. All Foundation Academy students wear uniforms. Uniforms can be purchased through Risse Brothers uniforms, located at 1401 Beulah Rd. Ste 116-118 in Winter Garden (407.554.2253).

When can I drop off my student in the morning?

Preschool students may be dropped off between 7:30 am and 8:15 am.

Where do I find information sent home by the teachers or school?

Preschool students each have a class folder in which teachers place assignments and announcements for students to take home every Friday. General information from the school is sent out every Thursday via The Keystone, our e-newsletter.

Plant Street FAQs

When can I drop off my student in the morning?

Students may be dropped off between 7:30 am and 8:15 am.

When may I visit my student at school?

Parents are always welcome to eat lunch with their lower school student. Arrangements should be made in advance with the main office.

How do I get my student's homework assignments?

During an absence due to illness exceeding one day, parents may receive homework assignments via renweb or by contacting their teacher via email.

What do students wear for P.E.?

Plant Street students remain in their daily uniform for P.E. Tennis shoes are required.

Tilden FAQs

When can I drop off my student in the morning?

Students may be dropped off anytime between 7:15 am and 7:40 am. Students who arrive between 7:15 am and 7:30 am should remain in the commons area until the building is opened.

How do I get my student's homework assignments?

Renweb allows students and parents to see an overview of lesson plans for the coming week, assignments and grades, and allows access to course outlines and resources provided by the teacher. Teachers may also communicate via email to individual students and parents or to the entire class regarding assignments or announcements pertinent to the class.

What do students wear for P.E.?

Students taking a P.E. class are required to wear a P.E. uniform and are assigned a P.E. locker. Teachers will provide information on the first day of class.

How do I order my student's Chromebook?

Chromebooks are automatically ordered for all new 8th - 12th grade students and will be issued at one of the New Family events or the Open House event at the beginning of the school year, depending on enrollment date.

How does my student register for classes?

Our guidance department contacts newly enrolled students and families with information on choosing courses. Phone and in-person appointments are also available upon request.

A Culture of Philanthropy at FA

Foundation Academy is a private school and as such, the education of every student is made possible by tuition and philanthropy. The Fund for Foundation Academy

The Fund for Foundation Academy is FA's annual giving program. It is the most important fundraising effort at FA. A gift to The Fund supports students and programs, faculty, and staff enrichment. In short, The Fund for Foundation Academy strengthens every aspect of our school - beyond what is possible with tuition alone. Ways to Give

Gifts of Cash: Most of the contributions to Foundation Academy are gifts of cash. Gifts of cash can be made on-line at <u>foundationacademy.net/igive</u> using a credit card or by check made payable to Foundation Academy and mailed to our Advancement Office located at the Upper School.

Gifts of Stock: FA gladly accepts gifts of publicly traded stock. Stock gifts can often have significant tax benefits for the donor including both a charitable income tax deduction valued at the time of transfer to the charity as well as possible avoidance of capital gains tax. Gifts-in-Kind: FA appreciates gifts-in-kind. For example, donations of equipment or musical instruments can often be used by the school. The donor determines the fair market value of the gift through appraisal or market comparisons.

Matching Gifts: Your employer may offer a matching gift program that can leverage your contribution to the school. Please check with your human resources office to confirm if your employer participates in this valuable program.
