**Required for all rising 1st-2nd grade students.*

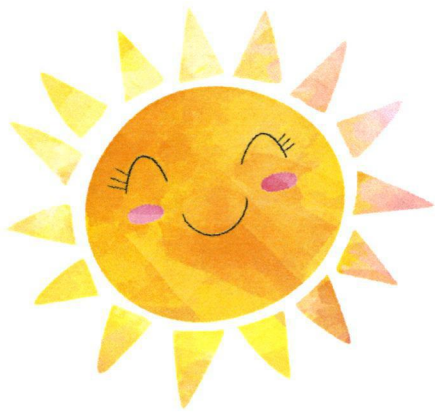
**This will count as a reading test grade for the first week of school.*
